Letter from the Rabbi

The month of May was filled with joyous gatherings in our community. This past month reminded me how alive and resilient our community is, and how much we can accomplish when many people step forward together.

As Binghamton University students worked on their finals, we celebrated the end of our Hebrew School year. A growing number of children had a great time learning and being together. Much of the credit goes to the enthusiastic and passionate Binghamton students who taught with us. We ended the year with presentations for parents, reviewing the foundational Torah narratives we studied and the central holidays and their core practices.

Looking ahead, we hope to build on this new model, welcome many of our teachers back, and support the parents who have stepped into leadership and supervision. If you are a parent, grandparent, or simply a community member with a passion for passing on our tradition to the next generation, next year, please be in touch with me or the office so we can talk about ways to get involved.

We also held a cookout Shabbat dinner on May 15th that was a smashing success. Over seventy people came together for music, games, grilled chicken, Shabbat tefillah, and, most of all, the company of our growing shul community. This was the last of six dinners we held over the school year. Each one brought together a unique slice of our community and inspired generous donations that more than covered our costs. When the next round of dinners is announced later this summer, I hope you will make it a priority to join us and, if you are able, to sponsor or help in the kitchen so we can keep this beautiful tradition going.

Shavuot, the final festival of the Jewish year, was also filled with beautiful events. Thanks to our new programming committee, on the eve of Shavuot we gathered in great numbers to hear a phenomenal local band. Then we began our second joint Tikkun Leil Shavuot with Temple Concord, learning together in anticipation of the reenactment of the revelation at Sinai, and concluding with twenty of us singing together at midnight. The two festival days that followed were full of moving prayer, Torah, Yizkor, and a special anniversary celebration for Howard Schwartz and Carol Herz. If you are celebrating a monumental birthday or anniversary, joining us on Shabbat is a meaningful way to mark the moment. Please let the office know when you have a simchah coming up so we can celebrate with you.

I also want to share more clearly what the coming year will look like and what I am asking of each of us. As Art and I wrote in our recent message, we have agreed on a part-time model for me to continue serving Temple Israel. I am optimistic that this will be a good arrangement all around. You will still be able to count on my support in critical moments and for regular Torah learning and tefillah, and I will be able to spend more time with my wife and attend to other aspects of my life.

For this model to succeed, we will need your partnership. In practical terms, I am asking each household to consider:

- How can I show up more regularly—for Shabbat, holidays, and programs?
- Where might I volunteer my time or skills this year?
- How can I strengthen my financial support, within my means?

Since our ancestors built the Mishkan in the wilderness, Jewish community has been sustained by collective effort. Just as the Mishkan stood only because many hands brought their gifts, Temple Israel can thrive only if many of us bring our time, presence, and resources. I am grateful to be walking into this next chapter together with you.

Letter from the President

Dear Members and friends of Temple Israel,

You recently received notice of our Annual Meeting, and I hope to see you all on June 16th at 7:00PM. If you can't make it to the synagogue, please join via zoom. In any case, please complete and submit the three proxies you received attached to the Notice. Your proxy helps ensure a quorum, and that your vote will be counted.

You will have noted on the slate that the position of president is indicated as "acting". I have to-date served as Temple Israel President for eight years, six years longer than the intended term. I have been honored to do so, but it is not healthy for the organization, and it is beyond time for a change. To date, we have not secured a successor, so if confirmed by your vote, I have agreed to act in this capacity while the search continues. I earnestly hope that some of you will step forward to accept leadership positions in the spirit of the Naso Torah portion we read last Shabbat - Rise up and be counted! We need you!

Our Rabbi Search Committee has been working diligently for months to find a successor, but the perfect match has so far eluded us. We will continue to recruit for a full-time candidate, but this pursuit will most likely secure a new Rabbi in Spring 2027.

Meanwhile, we are delighted that Rabbi Friedman has offered to support us on a part-time basis after his relocation to Ithaca. If approved at the Annual Meeting, he will provide many of our essential services throughout the 2026-2027 year, including: High Holidays 5787 - Rosh Hashanah & Yom Kippur Services; One Shabbat per month - Friday evening and Saturday morning; Two office days per week; One remote support day per week; Emergency Coverage - Funerals, severe illness, brit milah; Training and officiating at Bar/Bat Mitzvahs; Adult Education - Weekly and periodic classes; Pastoral outreach - visits to the sick and those in need; Counseling of congregants and proselytes. The Officers and Trustees unanimously approved this proposal.

In addition, we are working to secure the services of a Rabbinic Student intern from Hebrew College to lead one Shabbat weekend per month. For the remaining two Shabbat services we will rely on our lay daveners and periodic special guests.

Please make your plans to join us for upcoming events: Saturday, June 20th, we will honor Rabbi Micah and Rav Talia with a special kiddush to wish them well on the move to Ithaca; and on Sunday, July 26th, we will celebrate the 10th Anniversary of our new building, and the 140th Anniversary of Temple Israel, with a program and barbecue luncheon!

To continue to deliver the services, education, and programs that fulfill our mission, we need more than ever, your personal and financial support.

Happy Anniversary everyone! It hardly seems possible that next month we will be celebrating our 10th year in this building. Not only that, this year is the 140th anniversary of Temple Israel.

Originally called The Sons of Israel of Binghamton, the congregation was formed on November 30, 1885. It wasn't until 1899 when they moved into our first permanent synagogue building on Water Street. They stayed there until 1923 when they moved to their second building on Exchange Street. Unfortunately, due to a destructive anti semitic act in the late 1960's, we were compelled to build a new synagogue located on our present property. That building lasted from 1968 until its roof collapsed in December of 2024. Now we have our fourth synagogue building and a lot to celebrate.

If you would like to learn more about our long history and the people who created it, read the Temple Israel dedication book from our 1968 building. It is in our library. Believe it or not, a few descendants from the Water Street congregation are still members of our present congregation. Hope to see you in July. Have a wonderful summer.
