## Letter from the Rabbi:

"When we enter Adar, we multiply joy!" (Babylonian Talmud Ta'anit 29a)

This year the ancient early Spring month of Adar aligns with March and invites us to do our part to magnify the joy and goodwill in the world.

This year, many of us may find this particularly challenging. Our cold winter seems like it will continue for a while longer. In our community, along with much of the world, we are coping with a great deal of uncertainty and concern for the immediate and long term future. In our people's ancient homeland Eretz Yisrael, this is particularly pronounced as the hostage exchange and ceasefire deal are currently stalled.

So, while our tradition teaches this is a season of joy, our experience may not naturally lead us to increased joy. How can we reconcile this tension?

We can come together to join in the life of our community, of course! In this month ahead, we will have opportunities to sing our hearts out together as we celebrate Purim as well as to comfort grieving members of our community. We will have the opportunity to wrestle with how Torah shines light into current events as well as to welcome new children to our community. We will raise funds for the future of our synagogue as well as for the immediate needs of hungry people in our local community.

As we come together to engage in the Mitzvot through which our tradition offers structures of support for the years and seasons of our lives, we can cultivate a deep sense of joy and goodwill. This deep joy derived from our deep connections with each other, with G-d and Torah, is a core ingredient for resilience of heart and spirit. It may very well be that this resilience born from the joy of community that has enabled our people to persevere throughout the generations.

This month, please consider how you would like to embrace these opportunities to join together with your Temple Israel community. May we together magnify our joy!

Zach Mayer is a well-known musician who is part of a wave of new Jewish musical artists and facilitators of communal song who intertwine love for traditional Jewish music with a contemporary style. Zach brings people together through the power of <u>nigunim</u>, spiritual wordless melodies, rooted in Jewish tradition. He channels his family lineage of the four generations of cantors before him, as he helps communities find their own joyous voices in song.

#### Friday - Music, Megillah, Kabbalat Shabbat and a Nosh

We will kick off the weekend's activities starting at 4:30 pm with lively Purim tunes, schmoozing and noshing followed by the Megillah reading around 5pm. We will then dive into spirited music and dance. As Shabbat approaches, we will transition into Kabbalat Shabbat with melodies that bring joy and connection. A simple dinner will complete the evening's Shabbat celebrations. Remember it's Purim! Costumes are welcome!

#### Saturday - Musical Tefilah for Kids! Havdalah and Harmony for All!

In the morning at 10:15 children of all ages and their families are invited to a special Shabbat morning in the chapel for a service including storytelling, games and songs tailored for kids of all ages. The morning culminates in a special <u>hakafah</u>, where the children and their parents march into the main service in the sanctuary, singing and dancing alongside the community! A kiddush will follow services.

In the evening starting at 7 pm join with fellow congregants and the local Jewish community for an inspiring evening of music! Zach will lead us in a soulful Havdalah service at 7:30 pm. An inspirational and participatory concert will follow. The concert will include Zach's original melodies, nigunim, Jewish songs and chants designed to uplift, delight and heal. Community musicians wishing to play their instruments in accompaniment with Zach are encouraged to reach out to Temple Israel for more information on how to obtain sheet music. Light refreshments will be served.

#### Sunday - Singing in Harmony Workshop

Join Zach at 11 am for an engaging workshop exploring the art of harmony and the spiritual power of song. Together we will learn two melodies — a traditional nigun and one of Zach's original compositions — while discovering which elements are rooted in tradition and which are new. Zach will share practical techniques for blending voices, and provide a glimpse into his artistic process, including his method of using melody as a Jewish spiritual practice. This fun and participatory session is open to all. Light refreshments will be served.
