L'Shanah Tovah!

Here's to a good new year for everyone who is a part of our Temple Israel community, our greater Binghamton Jewish community, and all of our family and friends wherever they might be!

So far, this new year 5784 has been busy and filled with meaningful and joyful community events! From my perspective, we had a very good turnout for our services on both Rosh haShanah and Yom Kippur, but more importantly, those of us who were able to join together in person and online *davenned* together with heart and soul. I was privileged to share with the community some of my interpretations of the traditional words of the *Mahzor* that guide our prayer over the High Holidays, and I was glad to hear that what I shared was resonant with quite a number of members of our community!

This year, the start of October arrives along with the start of one of our most fun festivals: Sukkot. Somehow, every year, in each different context in which I find myself, even though I know to anticipate that Sukkos will begin very soon after Yom Kippur, I experience a degree of whiplash as I work to build a sukkah and to find *schach*, natural plant matter to serve as the shade of the temporary structures that become our homes for a week in the early Fall. Part of this whiplash is surely rooted in all that needs to be accomplished, even as we have already worked very hard to prepare for Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur.

However, another shade of this experience is rooted in the starkly different moods of Yom Kippur and Sukkot. While on Yom Kippur, we make time to somberly consider our mortality and we refrain from any food or drink. On Sukkot, we call this time *Z'man Simchateinu* (the period of our rejoicing) and we are encouraged by our tradition to share special treats with everyone as a way of feeding a shared experience of *simcha*. While these two holidays seem to be very different, they are each anchored in practices that lead us to embodied awareness of the fragility of our lives: fasting on Yom Kippur and dwelling outside on Sukkot. In different ways, on each of these holy days, Judaism encourages us to experience this awareness joyfully, with song and community!

This year, at Temple Israel, we will have a full celebration of Sukkot all the way through Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah! From joyous services with Hallel during Sukkot and dancing with the Torah on Simchat Torah to studying the book of Ecclesiastes over lunch on Tuesday and eating and playing with young children and families, our sukkah and our sanctuary will be filled with life this month! Please, join us for as much of our joyous celebrations as you can!

After Simchat Torah, we have much more to look forward to! I know I am looking forward to a kick-off event with Sisterhood in the evening of 10/24 and a youth-group kick-off event for teenagers beginning with Havdalah on 10/28. Later October is also a great time to make a plan to meet with me, to get to know each other, and to talk about whatever you would like to discuss!
